## Summary

Probable Medieval settlement, consisting of tofts, crofts, buildings, boundaries, hollow ways and an enclosure, seen as earthworks.

## Notes

Centred TF 243965. Wold Newton shrunken medieval village. In 1975 earthworks were observed south and west of the present village, between the Manor House at TF 242969 and South Farm at TF 244961, interrupted in places by modern houses and gardens. They comprise toft boundaries, possible house sites, and an old lane West of the present main street. The church, a Victorian structure, occupies an isolated site on the West side of the village (TF 29 NW 21). (1)

This area of village already deserted by 1824: the few house plots shown are those still occupied today. (2)

The Medieval settlement remains, referred to by the previous authorities, were seen as earthworks and mapped from poor quality air photographs. Remains of tofts, with crofts behind, continue southwards the line of present properties to the west of the road through the village. These are visible from TF 2233 9651 to TF 2443 9624. The remains of a building are visible, centred at TF 2440 9639, in one of the tofts. A possible hollow way, centred at TF 2437 9640, is visible running between two of the tofts. To the east of the church, but still on the west side of the village, are the remains of a building visible as an embanked enclosure, measuring 20m by 10m, centred at TF 2426 9677. This is adjacent to a possible hollow way. The fragmentary remains of two more possible buildings are visible, just to the south, centred at TF 2429 9674 and TF 2430 9671. A fragment of a possible croft boundary is visible, south of the buildings, centred at TF 2426 9669. All the features described above are the earthworks referred to by authority 1. More remains of crofts are visible, behind the present properties to the east of the road through the village. These extend from TF 2442 9698 to TF 2454 9635. A hollow way, probably a back lane, extends along the back of the properties, from TF 2444 9670 and TF 2454 9635. (Morph No. LI.316.4.1-13)
