

A number of other dedication festivals have taken place this week, viz., at St. Paul's, Bow-common; All Saints, Margaret-street, which was crammed on Sunday at all the services—a novelty being the intoning of the prayers in the evening by a Bishop (Dr. Morrell), who had preached in the morning; All Saints, Grosvenor-road, Pimlico, where the services were very heartily rendered; All Saints, Notting-hill, the decorations of which were very effective; All Saints', Blackheath; St. Saviour's, Leeds; St. John Baptist, Colwick, Notts; All Saints, Winterbourne Down, Bristol; All Saints, Warwick; St. Paul's, Newton Abbott, Devon, the Bishop of Jamaica, and the Hon. and Rev. C. L. Courtenay being the preachers; and at Wold Newton, Lincolnshire, the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishop of Lichfield preaching. At St. Stephen's, Shepherd's-bush, All Saints' Day was observed as a Thanksgiving day for the harvest; and Wednesday last at St. Alban's, Holborn, the preachers being the Revs. Dr. Evans and W. R. Wroth. The fruits of the earth were offered on the altar. The screen was tastefully decorated with corn, wheat, barley, grapes, and other fruits. A noteworthy feature was the introduction of vegetables, such as carrots, turnips, &c. The Ambrosian *Te Deum* was sung after Evensong.
