ENGLISH COUNTIES

LINCOLNSHIRE continued

South Witham. Bordering the main road and Old Post Lane:
40 trees, consisting of lime, beech (Fagus sylvatica), sycamore (Acer Pseudoplatanus); planted and presented by Sir Lyonel Tollemache, Bt.

Sutton-on-Sea. On a public green behind sandhills adjoining the sea: 2 red hawthorn, 3 horsechestnut, 3 elm, 3 sycamore (Acer Pseudoplatanus); planted by the two oldest and two youngest members, and the officers of Sutton-on-Sea Women's Institute.

On the edge of green lawns behind the sand dunes, and along a new road near by:

42 English elm (*Ulmus campestris*), 2 laburnum, 1 purple-leaved plum (*Prunus Pissardii*), 1 red hawthorn (*Crataegus Oxyacantha* var.), 4 sycamore (*Acer Pseudoplatanus*), 1 thorn; planted and presented by individual donors. Seats have also been provided.

Swineshead. In the School Playground:

I oak; presented by the Holland County Council.

Tattershall. On the Village Green:

I lime; planted by J. Wills Esq., the oldest inhabitant; presented by the Coronation Committee.

Winterton. In the garden of The Chalet, 41, King Street:

11 purple-leaved plum (*Prunus Pissardii*); planted by the owner, O. C. Brown Esq., assisted by G. Taylor Esq.

Wold Newton. In the Churchyard:

I plane; planted by the Rector, the Rev. B. E. Bettison, B.A.; presented by W. M. Wright Esq., M.A., J.P.

Woodhall Spa. In St Hugh's School Playing Field:

An avenue and clump of 80 trees, consisting of oak, white and pink chestnut (Aesculus Hippocastanum and A. carnea), spruce, Scots fir (Pinus sylvestris); planted by boys of the School; presented by G. R. Forbes Esq.

Worlaby. In the Recreation Ground:

I horsechestnut (Aesculus Hippocastanum); planted by Mrs A. Fidell; presented by King's College, Cambridge.
