

LINDSEY PETTY SESSIONS.—On Tuesday, the 20th inst., before G. M. Alington, Esq., and a bench of magistrates, Mary Smith and Ann Smith, two tramping Irishwomen, who were apprehended in an outhouse in the farm of Mr. Francis Iles, at Wold Newton, were committed to Louth House of Correction for three months, to hard labour, as rogues and vagabonds. It was proved that these women made a practice of sleeping in outhouses or farms, and prostituting themselves to the farming servants.—John Forman, of Cleethorpes, was fined 18s. and costs, for an assault upon Thomas Brown, of Cleethorpes.—Francis Gooseman, of Great Grimsby, appeared to a summons, charging him with damaging trees in Bradley Wood, by gathering nuts. On his producing a letter from the steward, to Sir John Nelthorpe, Bart., authorising his brother and any of his family to gather nuts, of which he availed himself, the information was withdrawn.—William Lancaster, also of Great Grimsby, appeared to a summons, charging him with a like offence. Discharged on paying costs, and promising not to offend again.
