

On Tuesday, a man of the name of Thomas Harrison, was examined before the county magistrates at Grimsby. It appeared that he left Hull by the steam-packet, on Tuesday week. During the night, he stole ten sheep skins from the premises of Mr. Wright and another farmer, at Wold Newton. He conveyed the skins to Grimsby upon a horse, which he took out of the farm yard, and turned adrift on the Wednesday morning. He then sold the skins to a fell-monger, and returned to Hull by that day's boat. . . .
