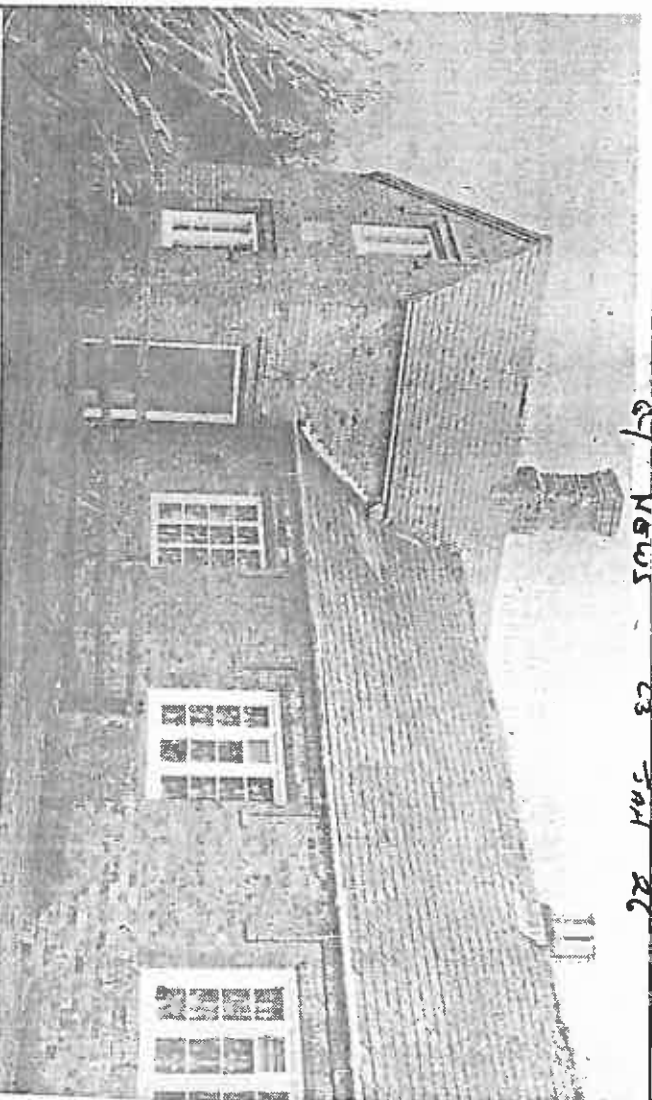

# End of term for house

ONE of Wold Newton's oldest buildings, the School House, (above) is to be demolished.

Clethorpes Housing Committee heard on Monday that the house is unfit for human habitation. There is no hot water supply, bath,

wash-basin, or toilet and there is damp and woodworm inside the house.

A report to the council said that it would cost over £2,800 to make the house fit again but it would still only be worth around £850.

A spokesman for the Diocesan Board of Education, who own the house, said on Wednesday. "The house will be demolished once the occupants have moved into their new accommodation in April.

"The old school, which adjoins the house, will be made good however, so that it can be used by the village as a meeting room," he added.

The house and school were built in 1845.
